Ballot Measure 1: Sick Leave



- X Introduces mandatory paid sick leave
- X Requires sick leave roll-over even if the individual isn't continually employed by the business.
- X Introduces vague and overly broad definitions of what constitutes sick leave.

- Increases Alaska's minimum wage by more than \$3 over the next 3 years.
- X Tips can't be included when calculating wages.

Increase the cost of goods and services




Threatens small businesses, limits economic growth
