

Refining Across Alaska






1. Marathon Kenai



- 72,000 barrel/day refinery
- Primary products include gasoline, jet fuel, ULSD, diesel fuel, heavy fuel oils, propane and asphalt
- 300 Alaskans employed

2. Petro Star North Pole



- 22,000 barrel/day crude distillation unit
- Primary products include commercial and military spec jet fuels, home heating oil, low-sulfur diesel, asphalt oil and turbine fuel

3. Petro Star Valdez



- 60,000 barrel/day crude distillation unit
- 12,000 barrel/day distillate hydrotreater and associated process units (Clean Fuels Unit)
- Primary products are commercial & military spec jet fuels and ULSD (JP-5 for USCG Kodiak)



- Significant additional value to Alaska


2025 Contract update

Integrated Logistics Assets Supply Alaska






Crude / Fuels always moving to/from/around Alaska



- SW and SE Alaska are supported primarily by imported fuel from Far East and PNW
- Jet A is sourced from Far East to support TSIA high demand
- Asphalt and gasoline imported to Alaska
- Gasoline and heavy fuels exported to L48
- Domestic and International crude imported



Kenai LNG Terminal Project





Ideal near-term solution for LNG Imports

- Sales agreement with Harvest Alaska to purchase KLNG to support LNG imports
- Fastest solution to fill the natural gas shortage for utilities and refinery
- Existing and maintained to Federal and State regulations including LNG Storage, LNG Dock all connected to the local distribution system.
- Engineering and project evaluation underway
- Believe its complimentary to ongoing Alaska LNG evaluation
