Methodology

- Compiled and analyzed secondary data from published and unpublished sources
- IMPLAN[™] (Impact Analysis for PLANning) input-output modeling and refinements
- Interviews with an array of construction industry leaders (i.e., commercial and industrial structural, highway, residential, etc.) to gain better understanding of spending patterns and inform the modeling
- Connected with >125 businesses and organizations about 2019 and 2020 spending (ISER method)

How Money Flows Through Our Economy



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In 2018, Alaska's Construction Industry...

Employed Alaskans	 Employed 23,613 workers, including wage and salary, and self-employed workers 82% Alaska Residents making 86% of Alaska wages 1 in 20 Alaska jobs (5%) was in construction
Paid Alaskans	 Paid \$2.2 billion in labor income, or 7% of all earnings in Alaska
Generated Multiplier Effects	 Total impacts of 41,300 jobs and \$3.3 billion in wages 9% of total employment in Alaska 10% of total labor income in Alaska
